Nebraska Medicine is a proud sponsor of the Gateway to Success Scholarship and is dedicated to fostering the growth and advancement of healthcare leaders through education and professional development. The Gateway to Success Scholarship financially assists first-generation college students demonstrating academic excellence, leadership, and educational commitment. The Gateway to Success Scholarship is available to four new incoming undergraduate students per academic year. In addition to demonstrating excellence in the classroom, Gateway to Success Scholars must demonstrate leadership in their schools/workplace and communities.

Scholarship Criteria

- Must be a new student at Clarkson College and enrolled full-time in an associate or bachelor's degree program.
- Must be a first-generation student. For this scholarship, first-generation is defined as an individual whose parents
 did not complete a baccalaureate degree or who resided with and received support from only one parent who did
 not complete a baccalaureate degree.
- Exceptional academic achievement demonstrated with a 3.0 high school GPA or higher or a 3.0 college transfer GPA or higher. Transcript reviewed.
- Must have demonstrated financial need (determined by current FASFA).
- Demonstrates values of compassion and caring through service to others. Applicants must submit a list of service hours completed and one contact person to verify hours if needed.
- Must list involvement in extracurricular activities, honor societies, professional organizations, etc.
- Demonstrated leadership through involvement in multiple school, workplace, and/or community activities. List years of contribution and leadership positions held.
- Applicants must provide two letters of recommendation of their choice.
- Complete a 500-word essay that is typed, double-spaced, and with a 12-point font in Times New Roman.
 - A brief introduction of who you are to the selection committee.
 - A brief reflection on how you have demonstrated values of compassion and caring through service to others (i.e., community and volunteer work, work/life experience, etc.).
 - A brief description of the challenges you have faced as a first-generation student and how you plan to impact your community positively as a healthcare professional.
- Must maintain a 3.0 GPA each semester, be continuously enrolled as a full-time student, and be in good academic
 and behavioral standing to continue receiving the scholarship.

Award Amount

A \$15,000/year automatically renewable scholarship for four years toward a bachelor's degree or two years toward an associate's degree.
