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Clarkson College Mission Statement

The **Key Statistics** report serves as a “snapshot” of Clarkson College data over an academic year. The Key Statistics report is comprised of overarching fundamental measures of the college, presented in past and present trends. It is a college-wide report consisting of eight sections of statistics: Demographics, Admissions, Enrollment, Financial Assistance to Students, Retention Rates, Graduation and Completion Rates, Faculty, Financial and Professional Development. This report focuses on Clarkson College, the institution.

The **Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)** is the core postsecondary education data collection program for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the United States Department of Education. IPEDS collects data on postsecondary education in the United States in seven areas: institutional characteristics, institutional prices, enrollment, student financial aid, degrees, and certificates conferred, student persistence and success, and institutional human and fiscal resources. This data is completed in the Fall term of each academic year.

Our Story

- Clarkson College is a private, accredited, non-profit college in Omaha, NE that was founded in 1888. Clarkson College operates on a semester system offering certificate and degree opportunities in the fields of Nursing (BSN, MSN, DNP), Healthcare Administration (BS and MS), Community Health (BS), Education & Leadership and Interprofessional Leadership (EdD), Health Information Management (AS and BS), Physical Therapist Assistant (AS and BS), Psychology (BS), Radiography (AS), Medical Imaging (BS), General Studies (AS), various Certificate and Minor Program options and Professional Development offerings.
