

Clarkson College accepts transfer credit from Northeast Community College. The transfer guide shows how courses completed at Northeast Community College will be transferred to Clarkson College. It is important for students transferring credit to Clarkson College to submit a final official transcript after completing all course work from other institutions. Students must receive a grade of "C-" or higher to be considered for transfer credit. Clarkson College does not accept transfer credit for courses taken after enrollment at Clarkson College.

**2+2 Option:** If you are entering the program with an associate degree or higher from an accredited institution, you will be able to transfer 60 credit hours and may be able to complete the bachelor's degree in as few as four semesters.

All courses are offered at Clarkson College and not necessary for admission.
